

I was asked to write about what Trinity means to me. Wow, the memories. I haven't worshipped in Trinity since I moved to New Jersey in 2001 but that doesn't mean that it doesn't hold a special place in my heart. It was the church that I grew up in and was confirmed in and the church where I said my final goodbyes to my mother. It was also the church where I made great friends at Sunday School and Youth Group. Who could forget those memorable ski trips? It was also the church where I always thoroughly enjoyed reaching up towards the ceiling to light the candles on the advent wreath on Christmas Eve as an alcolyte. It would always spin and spin and gave the congregation a good laugh. In fact, the year after I went to college they decided to move that to the floor. I like to think that I helped in that decision. But seriously, it was the church where I met so many wonderful people who to this day I still think about. This is the church that was there for my parents when my mom was sick and always made sure that my dad came to church after she passed away. I continue to get the monthly newsletter and I take it to my dad's and fill him in on all the happenings at the church. I know he misses it as much as I do.

I remember my mother telling me that the first contact that she had with the church was when they first moved to Bayville and Pastor Mohlenhoff came to the home to greet my parents and it was about 105 degrees out on that day in July 1978, and my mom was like I can't believe he came on this day as she was unprepared for his visit as they were all sweaty and still unpacking. During lent I always think about the Lenten soup suppers. Trinity has some great cooks!

I am currently the youth minister in my church and I model my youth group after the one at Trinity that was such a big part of my life growing up. How did Norm and Alice Sorenson do it for all those years? Someday I hope to make a trip back to visit but in the meantime I'll have all the wonderful memories and people in my heart to remind me.

Hello everyone. I wanted to give you an update on my father Roger Phillips. In 2013 I sold his house in Bayville and moved him closer to me in New Jersey (I'm right outside Philadelphia). He moved into an assisted living facility. I finally found a good neurologist who diagnosed my dad with a condition called progressive Supra nuclear palsy. It's in the same class as Parkinson's disease. Unfortunately, after about a year in assisted living his condition deteriorated to the point that I had to move him to a nursing home called St. Mary's. He currently has a feeding tube and has lost the ability to verbally communicate anything more then one or two-word answers but his mind is sharp. Although a huge statue of Mary is outside his room, that hasn't deterred him from doing everything he's not supposed to do. I guess you could say he's the same old Roger who doesn't listen to anyone and does what he wants to do. All mail can be sent to my address at 2312 Hamilton Dr., Voorhees NJ 08043. Philippians 4: 6-7

"...do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all under standing, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

I remember when Pastor and I brought Hannah home from the hospital I was elated with feelings of happiness and joy, but in the back of my mind feelings of anxiety started to creep in. One night when she was a few days old, I woke up in the middle of the night and felt my heart pounding, mind racing, and an overwhelming feeling of anxiousness come over my entire body because I thought she had stopped breathing. She was perfectly fine, and it took me a very long time to calm down and stop feeling anxious. After giving birth anxiety can be come a part of your life because you are responsible for this tiny human being whom you love more than anything in the world but you also have absolutely no idea what to do as a new mother. During these times of anxiety I learned to pray to God for comfort during this time so that I could enjoy the new experience of motherhood.

One Bible verse that can be comforting during times of anxiousness is Philippians 4: 6-7. God is in the driver's seat and we just need to be able to give all our worries and anxiety to Him, and that He will lead us through difficult times in our lives. Whether we realize it or not, God is always there for us, and guides us in this life that we live. We need to just let Him be in control and not try to control the situation ourselves. This Bible verse brought me peace because I was able to share all my feelings of anxiety with God, and thank Him for this precious little baby he had blessed our family with. When we have the Word of God in our hearts that is our biggest weapon against any type of anxiety, fears, or depression we may have in our life.

Being able to rely on God for the troubles we experience in our lives gives us the confidence and self-reliance to be able to carry on and it suddenly starts to outweigh whatever feelings of anxiety and worry we may be suffering from. Things are always going to happen in our lives that may cause anxiety but being equipped with Christ Jesus and His Word will protect us from it. Whenever in doubt, just pray and it will give your mind and heart rest from whatever is troubling you.

Prayer: Heavenly Father, thank you for the power that is reflected in Your Word and for the strength that we receive through the word of prayer. When life gets overwhelming or we have feelings of anxiety help us to remember the comfort that is found through Your Word. Help us to understand and realize that when we pray, we are able to unload all our anxiousness and worry before You and be put at ease. Thank you for everything you have blessed us with in our lives. In Jesus' Name, Amen.


